Legionella is bacteria which can lead to Legionnaires Disease through warm aerosol producing systems such as Air Conditioning Units. 

Affects around 5% of those exposed to the bacterium;

There is 2-10 days incubation where symptoms start showing after being initially exposed;

Unfortunately Legionnaires' disease can kill, Fatality rates are 1 in 8 of affected people (12%) die.”
